Junior Infants have settled in so well already! We have been reading the story of Elmer and The Rainbow Fish. We have been learning songs and poems in English and Gaeilge. Our Aistear (play) area is The Home Corner. We have been learning about the rooms in the house and discussing the people in our family.

Senior Infants have been very busy in September. We have been learning all about ourselves and our bodies in English and Gaeilge. We have painted fabulous selfportraits and are enjoying decorating our classrooms with our lovely work.

Croi In **Ms. Egan's** class, have welcomed two new boys Cian and Siddarth. They are so excited to have new friends in our class. This month, they have been working on the theme 'At School'. They have revised the vocabulary of Colours and School objects. In Circle Time, they learned a new action song 'Open and Shut.' We read the books *Monkey Puzzle* and *Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What do you See?* In Art, they created a classroom display of colours and a 'Friendship Tree'.

In **Ms. Winter's** class have welcomed two new boys to the class, Dylan and Jack. They are both junior infants. We've been working on Elmer, Jack and Jill, Humpty Dumpty, body parts and we've loved listening to music.

First Class have been studying pond life and the life cycle of a frog. They really enjoyed making Pointillism art and pop up frogs. They have also been discussing themselves and all about their families.

Second class are very excited to be back at school! We are getting to know our new classes and class mates. We even have a different yard to play on with footballs, skipping ropes and hula hoops. This month we have been learning all about myself and the body in both Irish and English! We have taken an interest in Cubism and have created some really interesting drawings. Just like Picasso!

Third class In English we did recount writing, Maths, we did lots of re grouping and re naming for addition and subtraction. We had lots of fun Grawing portraits in Art and studying the counties of Ireland for Geography. We looked at our fingerprints when we studied our skin in science. We also loved taking a few trips to our new school library!

Fourth Class have been learning about the 7 Natural Wonders of the World. We completed projects on each Wonder. In Maths, we have learned about new 2-d shapes, including rhombus, pentagon, parallelogram, octagon and different types of triangle. In Science, we discussed the bones in our body and made a skeleton in art using cotton buds. We measured our heart rate by feeling our pulse, before and after exercise. We learned about the history of the GAA and designed our own GAA crests. In Gaeilge, we met 'spásáraí' named Rac agus Ról from Planéid Ceoil and their favourite Bia Fifth class have been working hard since they started back in September. They've been learning about electrical circuits in Science. They've also been learning about geology in geography. They learned that rocks can be largely split into three groups: igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic. In history, fifth class has been studying the secretive schools known as hedge schools which were common in 1800s Ireland. Sixth class have been focusing on our locality and tourism. We have identified areas of interest and compared our local area to county Galway and have made holiday brochures to attract tourists to visit Co. Galway. In history we are researching different feasts and festivals from around the world, including Eid, Diwali, Christmas and St. Patrick's Day, and we are looking forward to presenting our projects to learn more about each one. There have been some great moving debates taking place within the classes, to link in with the persuasive writing that we are practising this month. We are also enjoying using our protractors in maths to measure and draw lines and angles and in Gaeilge we have been practising our comhrá on Mé Féin. We have all began to settle into 6th class and we are looking forward to the year ahead
