Junior Infants have been very busy learning all about the theme of food, over the last couple of weeks. They have been listening to the stories 'Handa's Surprise' and 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and have been learning the nursery rhymes 'I'm a Little Teapot' and 'Hot Cross Buns'. They have been making some beautiful caterpillars and butterflies in art and have been playing in the Cafe in the Role Play Area. They have been learning all about the lifecycle of a butterfly and have been discussing their five senses. As you can see, they have been very busy children! Senior Infants have been learning all about Space! We read some amazing books, our favourites were 'Whatever Next!' and 'All about Space'. We talked about how to use the internet safely when playing online games/watching youtube etc. We have started learning our new tricky words for homework and the children have been making amazing progress. Second class have been learning all about Ocean Habitats. We used the iPads to research our favourite ocean creature and wrote really interesting information reports. Our teachers were super impressed with our neat handwriting and amazing facts! We created ocean dioramas using shoeboxes. We used lots of different materials to decorate our dioramas and had lots of fun! In Maths we were learning about Data. We surveyed our class to find out everyone's eye colour, favourite video games, favourite crisps and presented them in pictograms and bar charts. This month we have also been learning how to stay safe on the internet. We learned that the best thing to do if you see something online that worries you or makes you feel uncomfortable is to close it down and tell an adult as soon as possible!

Ms Kavanagh's class In Room 1 we have been learning about homes, the different rooms and items in each room and we are also making 3D houses in art. We have also been learning about resilience and practicing different ways of relaxing and strategies we can use to keep us calm. Ms. McPartlan's Class We were learning about space, Some of us memorised the names of all the planets in order from the sun. The children really enjoyed doing art work based on stars, astronauts, aliens and rockets. We made fruit rockets during our Cooking Lesson and some hot chocolate on a colder day. We are lucky to have Coach Martin back to teach us more GAA skills this year. The days are getting darker and we are making a huge effort to do our exercise outside when it is bright.

Third class This month in Rang a Trí, the boys and girls have been very excited to start back with GAA training! In maths, we have been learning about 2D/3D shapes, symmetry, and have been working extremely hard on their multiplication tables. In English, we have been doing lots of work on Report Writing, and have been creating reports inspired by the animals in Dublin Zoo! For History, we have been learning about Ancient Greece, Greek Mythology, and the History of the Olympics.
